ECTORAL

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TRAINING ELECTORAL STAKEHOLDERS

- Solid professional knowledge and skills are required to manage electoral processes effectively
- What to identify when planning a training programme:
 - who needs electoral training;
 - what skills and knowledge different groups of stakeholders will acquire;
 - how to deliver training to various participants taking into account their preferences and the resources available;
 - when and how often training for different groups should be conducted.

PEA'S TRAINING PROGRAMMES AND ITS STAKEHOLDERS



Permanent training

- mayors;
- secretaries of administrative-territorial units;
- public services for accounting of the population at a local level;
- prefect institutions.




Periodic training

- members of the polling stations bureaus (presidents and vice-presidents);
- authorities and institutions with responsibilities in elections;
- financial trustees of political parties;
- international election observers;
- other EMBs in need of electoral assistance;
- the media.

PEA'S PERMANENT TRAINING

 conducted monthly at the local level by experts from the PEA's branches and county offices

TRAINING MEMBERS OF THE POLLING STATIONS BUREAUS AND AUTHORITIES WITH RESPONSIBILITIES IN ELECTIONS

Techniques, methods, materials

instructor-led face to face training

lecture component, Q&A sessions, demonstrations and examples

training materials:

- nanual regarding the regulations on the electoral process, with detailed guide for electoral officials;
- posters with step-by-step instructions on the main electoral operations that take place in election day;
- □ flyers with a check-list regarding the electoral operations.

TRAINING MEMBERS OF THE POLLING STATIONS BUREAUS AND AUTHORITIES WITH RESPONSIBILITIES IN ELECTIONS IN 2014

- ▶ 173 sessions for people eligible to become presidents and vice-presidents of electoral bureaus;
- ▶ 329 sessions for the presidents and vice-presidents of the polling stations bureaus (37.064 persons trained for the EP elections and 37.505 for the presidential ones);
- ▶ 114 sessions for mayors and secretaries of administrativeterritorial units.

DIFFICULTIES WITH THE MODEL:

- numerous resources allotted;
- electoral officials heterogenic group in terms of education and experience in participating in other electoral processes;
- ▶ 2 hour training sessions with an average of 200 participants—limited accumulation of knowledge.

TRAINING FINANCIAL TRUSTEES OF POLITICAL PARTIES

- training sessions for financial trustees organized in each electoral period;
- goal: to familiarize the participants with the legal requirements regarding funding of competitors and electoral campaigns.

TRAINING THE MEDIA

- generally conducted in specific projects
- e.g.: "Electoral discourse without discrimination", develop ed in 2014 by PEA in partnership with a national NGO and the National Council for Combating Discrimination




TRAINING OTHER EMBs IN ELECTORAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMMES


- international stakeholders: MENA countries and Eastern Europe

2015 ELECTORAL LAW REFORM

REFORMS ADVOCATED AND PROPOSED BY PEA:

- ► The creation of a specialized body of electoral officials trained on a permanent basis by PEA's Electoral Expert Centre
- ► The computerisation of polling stations—new group of stakeholders: the computer operators in the polling station
